

IN COMMISSION TODAY.

**Motor Ladder Truck 30 Will Take
the Place of Chemical 5 at Egles-
ton Square.**

Chemical 5, one of the oldest com-
panies in the Boston Fire Department,
located in Egles-ton Square for 80 odd
years, will be disbanded at rolcall this
morning by Commissioner Cole. In place
of the chemical company there will be
established in the fire station at Egles-
ton Square motor-propelled Ladder 30.

Truck 30 is one of the three motor-
drawn vehicles recently purchased by
Commissioner Cole. Truck 29 has been
placed in commission at Callender st,
Dorchester, and Truck 31 has been lo-
cated in the new station at Oak sq.

The new apparatus is a combination
ladder and chemical and is equipped
with nine ladders, including two of the
extension type. The apparatus has all
the modern fire appliances.

Lieut Cornellus F. Driscoll and hose-
men Leonard F. Griffin, Carl F. Bode,
William A. S. Hughes, Michael J. Mur-
phy, Allan J. Jarvis and Thomas J.
Lacey of Chemical Engine 5 have been
shifted to Truck 30. Lieut Driscoll will
be in command.

The new ladder company will be
quartered in the same house with En-
gine 42, which is in charge of Capt
George H. Hutchings.
